Urban policy and planning

Cities are world's economic platforms for production, innovation, and trade. Urban areas offer significant opportunities for both formal and informal employment, generating a sizeable share of jobs.

However, urbanisation is leading to serious social and environmental problems, including increasing levels of poverty, lack of resources, space constraints, pollution, and climate change. The growth and prosperity of cities critically depend on how they are managed.

Our Urban Policy and Planning team provides support to governments and development partners on critical urban issues, particularly those of service delivery, urban infrastructure, urban climate resilience, governance and institutional support, and urban social protection. Our work is cross-cutting, as we work across thematic areas, such as master planning, economic modelling, and sectors such as water, sanitation, health, and livelihoods.

Sustainable urban development in India


Our in-house team of experts is based in India, and has worked on projects in Assam, Andhra Pradesh, Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Odisha, and Uttar Pradesh in the country. We collaborate with other sectoral teams, such as water, sanitation, and hygiene, climate change, monitoring and evaluation, and economic policy to address urban development issues in each of these sectors and subjects.

We worked with Community Systems Foundation to develop an online tool, aiming to scale up outcomeoriented urban planning for cities participating in the Smart Cities Mission.

In Assam, we supported the State Disaster
Management Authority and local authorities in four
cities to prepare climate resilient flood management
action plan. We also designed a framework for
promoting and introducing innovative market
mechanisms for climate risk insurance in Guwahati.

In Lucknow and Visakhapatnam, we are developing a behaviour communication change strategy to eradicate open defecation in these cities. Working together with Water & Sanitation for the Urban Poor Advisory, we are also researching consumer preferences for sanitation products.

We supported the World Bank to analyse methods to expand voluntary coverage of the Atal Pension Yojana and improve urban social protection in Delhi and Shimla. In Odisha, we are assessing whether the Socio-Economic Caste Census data is complete, accurate, and useable as an instrument for targeting beneficiaries for social protection schemes.
